

## **SAT SUMMER SHUTDOWN**

*The SAT Program shuts down its scoring system in late summer to prepare for the national testing program starting in October. For this testing year, the SAT program is shutting down the scoring system effective 1 August 2004.*

*Examinees experience significant score delays if tested after the end of June.*

*Only the ACT Assessment will be administered at Navy College in July and August for college entrance or officer programs.*

## **EVALUATION OF FOREIGN TRANSCRIPTS**

*DANTES has a web site that lists companies that evaluate foreign transcripts and belong to the National Association of Credential Evaluation Services (NACES).*

*Some colleges and universities evaluate foreign transcripts on their own. Other colleges and universities recommend or require the student with a foreign transcript to get the transcript evaluated by one of the companies that fall under NACES. These companies charge a fee and it is the student's responsibility to pay that fee.*
